- A. Sections to fill out
- B. Sketches to choose from
- C. Training images

Note - right click on an image and click to magnify



- Every section must be filled out to finalise the analysis
- Each section has several choices
- Some images have 1 or 2 coloured dots (yellow red or blue) these are primary miasm allocations
- Some images have no dots = no rating (this feature is average for human population
- Disregard dominant racial or geographical or sex features add in what you see on the face
- Click on the image a blue tick will appear in the section

# Section is ticked (D) Image is highlighted (E)



As more images are added an analysis will appear – THIS IS NOT THE FINAL ANALYSIS You will see the analysis change as you add or change the facial image for each section

```
The FINAL ANALYSIS – is to be chosen once ALL SECTIONS are completed with a tick
Example – only 4 sections filled out = Brown
Yellow 2
Red 1
Blue 1
```

NOTE this analysis will keep changing until it is finalised.

Be careful to add the closest image to your patients feature – if in doubt, choose the image with no points



As the analysis is further completed, more points will be added – note the change of miasm – wait till all sections are ticked before the final miasm (colour group) appears

The yellow, red and blue points will show (F) The miasm counter (G) – when all sections are ticked

- 5. HFA triangle shows remedy color coding





Facial structure = Blue group Remedy to choose = Conium

Note – where more than 1 remedy shows for the color group (miasm) add 1 or 2 more rubrics to try and differentiate – or start with the top remedy for that color group.

Where patients' responses are not strong

- 1. Check the face carefully
- 2. Take new photos if required see photo section in Help guide
- 3. If the facial analysis was incorrect, choose the top remedy from the same rep for the new color group
